PROLOGUE

Before we begin our historic journey, let me fill you in on a little bit of Charlotte history. Charlotte became the largest city in the two Carolinas' in the 1930's when it overtook Charleston, South Carolina as a major distribution (railroad), textile, and banking center. Charlotte was incorporated on Thursday November 7, 1768 after the General Assembly of North Carolina entertained then Royal Governor William Tryon (1765 -1771) and coerced him into granting the village of Mecklenburg a charter. As a tribute to the governor, the assembly renamed one of Charlotte's major streets after him -- Tryon Street. The General Assembly went a step further and decided to flatter **King George III** (of England) by naming this new county seat in honor of his young German-born wife -- Charlotte. This Book reads exactly how our **Charlotte City Tour™** has been presented since 1995 -- with updates -- beginning with the city's namesake Queen Charlotte. This tour/journey features the good, the bad, and the surprising nuggets of Charlotte, North Carolina, and American history.



Chapter I

BEGIN TOUR/JOURNEY

Charlotte became the largest city in the two Carolinas' in the 1930's when it overtook Charleston South Carolina as a major distribution textile and banking center. Charlotte was incorporated in 1768 after the North Carolina General Assembly entertained then Royal Governor William Tryon and coerced him into granting the village of Mecklenburg a charter. As a tribute to the governor, the assembly renamed one of Charlotte's major streets in his honor -- Tryon Street in

Uptown/Downtown/Center City. The General Assembly then went a step further, and in an effort to flatter King George III (of England), named this new county seat in honor of his young German-born wife -- Charlotte.



It was March 1991 when I attended an exhibit called "Balance of Power" at the old Charlotte Museum of **History** (replaced by the current facility in **1999**; *source-02*: http://charlottemuseum.org/about/) -- off Shamrock Road -- with my then business partner that I was introduced to some of Charlotte's rich Black history. I was so impressed that I asked my partner to jot down some notes (that I still have today) on the people and places covered. I then began making trips to the Carolina Room at the main library in Uptown/Downtown-Center City for further research and 130 hours later I had enough information to develop my first script (which I still have today) for the Queen City's first Black/African-American Heritage Tourtm (source-03: http://www.queencitytours.com/Black-African-American%20Heritage%20Tour-History.htm). I copyrighted it in October of 1993 and it is 21 pages long and printed on the old dot matrix-type paper. Since then it has been revised many times and today that script has been converted to a Microsoft Word format and is 16 pages long. I used that script to develop my third book on Charlotte's history. This book contains actual events that I have experienced as a tour guide; either personally or through the eyes of others that I have come in contact with since then.

CEDAR GROVE CEMETERY



This cemetery was out of sight and thus out of mind (source-98: http://www.queencitytours.com/pdf/ebook/blackcharlotte/observer-cedar-grove-1985.pdf) until a very courageous lady decided to do something about it on Tuesday February 7, 2006 when Ms. (Miss) Donna Dawson -- accompanied by her son Tyler -- brought the matter before the Mecklenburg Board of County Commissioners. Well; add a little politicking to the equation and you now have a big mess involving finger pointing and certain folk not willing to accept the blame and associated shame of not honoring the dead; some of who were military veterans. Then the rigmarole of "Is Mecklenburg County really responsible maintenance?", "Does anyone have that in writing, per local statues?", "Where can we find rakes?", and "Who is going to pay for this?" began.

In steps the local media and folks began to volunteer -- rather than sit around and wait for the politics to play out -- to help clean up years and years of neglect. I contributed by linking this cause to our 8th Annual QCT Toursm **Pilgrimage** Charlotte (source-19: http://charlottepilgrimagetour.com/) then took a stroll through before the clean-up and was quite intrigued at some of the headstones dating back to the late 1880's and to find evidence of burials by the old Alexander Funeral Home (covered later on our tour/journey). Some folks had speculated that perhaps Slaves were buried here but that is highly unlikely since the cemetery was opened in circa 1880, 15 years after the abolishment of Slavery via our 13th Amendment; besides that, a Bona Fide Slave cemetery will typically not have headstones as Slaves were considered property and thus property cannot own property. There was evidence that folks were using it as a cut through from the University Park Creative Arts School to the adjacent neighborhood, and as a place to hang out and drink and do the nasty. What kind of person would want to just hang out in a sacred place for the dead? Unfortunately, this place has once again fallen into neglect and has reverted to it's out of sight out of mind status. Hopefully someone reading this passage will organize another clean up and perhaps install a fence around the property to discourage creepy folks from hanging out in the final resting place of the dead.



Today, some folks are saying that the property is owned by the Cedar Grove Cemetery Association; according to the Mecklenburg County Tax Database (source-99: https://perry1644.wordpress.com/; see "Cedar Grove"). I checked and that organization does not exist here (at least on the Internet). I also checked the tax data base and no record exists for the property at 2498 Hildebrand Street which I obtained via Google Maps. The listed abandoned cemetery is as at https://www.findagrave.com/cgibin/fg.cgi?page=cr&CRid=2325160. It is for this reason

It is for this reason that I fought certain family members to have my father buried in a national cemetery in Milledgeville, Georgia (source-100: https://www.findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GSIn=whipple&GSfn=curtis&GSbyrel=all&GSob=n&GRid=32729990&df=all&), as opposed to a private one in his hometown of Dublin, Georgia.

Well folks, we have come to the end of part I [one] of this tour/journey of Charlotte's rich Black culture and history. I hope that you enjoyed reading this book as much as I have had in writing it; and of course developing and conducting tours since 1992. HISTORIC DATES:

1764 -- Slavery was introduced in Mecklenburg County (slave population was 40% or 6,800 by1860)

1768 -- Charlotte was incorporated

1847 -- Reverend Daniel Jackson Sanders, D.D., hired as first Colored (today Black/African-American) president of Johnson C. Smith University

1867 -- Black registered voters outnumbered white voters 726 to 566 (most Blacks voted Republican at that time out of allegiance to President Abraham Lincoln),

- Freedman's College of North Carolina (today Johnson C. Smith University) founded
 - -- Blacks voted for the first time in Charlotte
- **1868 1900 —** Thirteen Black men serve on Charlotte's Board of Alderman (today City Council)
- **1869** -- Four Wards setup as voting districts (1st, 2nd, and 3rd predominately Black until early 2000's)
- -- **1920** Was considered the golden age for Charlotte's Black business professionals because of the tremendous amount of community support
- -- Black population in Charlotte was 47% (today it hovers between 30-33%)
- Charlotte Messenger becomes Charlotte's first secular Black newspaper
- -- First graded school for Colored (today Black/African-American) children opens as the Myers Street School, Dr. George E. Davis becomes first Black (now African-American) professor at J.C.S.U.
- -- 93.4% of Charlotte Blacks were employed in domestic and personal service jobs
- -- The State legislature drafted an amendment which required every voter to be able to read and write any section of the constitution. In that same year, 47.6% of all Charlotte Blacks were illiterate
- -- The Charlotte Light Infantry, led by Colonel C.S.L.A. Taylor fought in the Spanish-American War
- -- Jim Crowe laws were not passed in North Carolina until around the turn of the century
- **1905** -- Brevard Street Library for Negroes opens in 2nd Ward

- **1909** Lincoln Theater for Colored (now Black/African-Americans) opens in 2^{nd} Ward (2^{nd} and Brevard Streets)
- 1915 -- Colored Charlotte published -- was Charlotte's first Black business & professional directory; featured 72 barbers, 24 grocery stores, 2 lawyers, 12 doctors, 28 tailors, 31 restaurants, and other establishments -- Edited by Mr. Charles H. Watson (of the AME. Zion Publishing House)
- **1923** -- 2^{nd} Ward opens as the first Colored (today Black/African-America) high school in Charlotte. Classes ended at the 10^{th} grade level.
- **1938** -- First Black Lawyer in Charlotte -- J. T. Sanders
- **1941** -- Charlotte hired first Black Police Officers Mr. A.M. Houston and Mr. James Ross
- 1947 -- Second Ward Extension School founded; later Carver College merged with CPCC (Central Piedmont Community College, 1949). Charlotte hires first full status Black police officers
- **1957** -- Dorothy Counts-Scoggins integrated Harding High School, 3 other students as well (first time in Charlotte history)
- 1960 -- Charles Sifford became the first Black golfer to play on the PGA Tour. He then played on the PGA Senior Tour. Dr. Reginald Hawkins founded the Mecklenburg Organization of Political Affairs and later helped draft the Voting Rights Act for the United States.

- **Mid 1960's** -- Hyde Park becomes first all-Black neighborhood (with restrictions) developed by Blacks. Dr. C.W. Williams and Dr. Walter Washington
- -- Henry Harvey Boyd designed the official Mecklenburg County seal
- -- Fred Alexander becomes first Black/African-American elected to modern day Charlotte City Council
- Dr. Reginald Hawkins becomes first Black/African-American to run for governor of North Carolina in the 20^{th} Century
- -- Black police officer Milton Gaines becomes first to be assigned a white partner
- -- Charlotte hires first Black/African-American female firefighter (Linda Lockhart)
- -- Harvey Gantt becomes the first Black Mayor in Charlotte history
- 1998 -- Charlotte ranked the number one city to live in for Blacks in the U.S. by Essence Magazine. Criteria: % Black population, overall household income in Charlotte, overall unemployment rate, overall cost of living, and because of the Afro-American Cultural Center and the 1997 Conference on Race. Congressman Mel Watt became the first African-American politician elected to office in a majority white district (12th). Ella Scarborough becomes first Black/African-American female to win a party's nomination (Democrat) for Mayor of Charlotte.
- -- Harry Jones hired as first Black County Manager
- Ed Dolby becomes first Black/African-American chairman of the Charlotte Chamber of Commerce
- Charlotte hires first Black/African-American marketing agency president (Melvin Tennant)

- **2005** -- Charlotte Bobcats and Charlotte Sting become the first major league sports franchises owned by a Black/African-American (Bob Johnson) in the United States
- **2008** -- Charlotte hires first Black/African-American police chief (Rodney Monroe)
- 2012 -- Democratic National Convention held in Charlotte from Tuesday September 4 through Thursday September 6; a first for the Queen City. President Barack Obama accepts Democratic nomination for second (and final) term

"C.S.L.A." TAYLOR

(1849-1934)

- -- Born a Slave in South Carolina
- -- Full name was Charles Samuel Lafayette Alexander Taylor
- -- Educated in Quaker Freedman Schools after Civil War, became a barber in Charlotte
- -- Served as Captain and Financial Secretary of the Neptune Volunteer Fire Company (Colored; today Black/African-American)
- -- Served as Colonel in the Charlotte Light Infantry called to active duty during the Spanish American War [1898]
- -- Served as Chairman of the Mecklenburg County Black Republican (today Democratic) Delegation
- -- Served as North Carolina General Assemblyman and as a North Carolina State Senator

W.C. "WILLIAM CASWELL" SMITH

(1854-1937)

- -- Assistant principal of Myers Street Graded School (Charlotte's first graded school for Blacks)

- -- Born in Cumberland County near Fayetteville, North Carolina
- -- Member of Charlotte board of Alderman (1882-1892), appointed consul to Sierra Leone (West Africa) by then President McKinley in 1898
 - -- Founding member of Grace A.M.E. Zion Church
- -- Lived in 2nd Ward (Old Brooklyn) near Grace A.M.E. Zion Church (off Brevard Street/uptown).
- -- J.T Williams Middle School named in his honor in 1962

BISHOP GEORGE WYLIE CLINTON

(1859-1921)

- -- Born in Lancaster County, South Carolina
- -- Minister, Editor, Bishop of the A.M.E. Zion Church until death in 1921

 - -- Founder of the A.M.E. Zion Church Quarterly

W.W. "WILLIAM WARREN" SMITH

(1862-1937, 1873-1924)

 - -- An African-American Builder and Architect
- -- Completed the Victorian Gothic brickwork on Grace A.M.E. Zion church (is located at 233 South Brevard Street -2nd Ward/Old Brooklyn in 1902)
- -- Co-founding member of Grace A.M.E. Zion Church (split from Clinton Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church in 1886)
- -- Brick Mason for the Hood Hall Seminary at Livingstone College (located in Salisbury, NC and built in 1906)
- -- Designed and constructed the Old A.M.E. Zion Publishing House building (was originally located on Brevard Street but has since been demolished)
- Designed the "MICo" building (is located at the corner of 3rd and Brevard Streets)

- -- Help start the Morrison Training School in Hoffman, NC
- -- Co-founded the Mecklenburg Investment Company (1921) in 2nd Ward
- -- Founder of the Afro-American Mutual Insurance Company

- -- Elected vice-chairman of the National Board of Directors of the N.A.A.C.P. in 1976, acting chairman in 1983, and chairman in 1984
