
Jeffrey (Jeff) Lynn Lowrance Curriculum vitae

- Served as chaplain of the annual Loch Norman Highland Games
- ♦ Has served on <u>ad hoc</u> groups for the Town of Huntersville concerning open space, the expansion of waste treatment facilities and the preservation of historic Beatties Ford Road
- ♦ Has lead efforts to locate and preserve slave cemeteries in Mecklenburg County through an organization call The Comprehensive Genealogical Services
- ♦ Instrumental in efforts to:
 - a. Restore the Cowan's Ford Monument at the intersection of Highway #73 and Beatties Ford Road
 - b. Return the grave marker of Revolutionary War hero Francis Bradley from McDowell County, NC
 - c. Bring back to North Carolina the wallet of General William Lee Davidson from the Archives in Great Britain
 - d. Rebuild the Rural Hill Marker demolished in a traffic accident at the intersection of Neck Road and Beatties Ford Road
- Performed the research that led to the use of historic names for two new schools on Beatties Ford Road
