# National Indigenous Art Fair, Sydney - 1-2 July

Head to the National Indigenous Art Fair for a weekend celebrating indigenous art, performances, panel discussions, bush food and craft workshops. Located in one of Sydney's most popular neighbourhoods, the Overseas Passenger Terminal in the Rocks will host more than 50 stallholders from art centres across New South Wales and Sydney's Blak Market. Visitors can purchase indigenous art, handmade jewellery, homewares, food and more. All proceeds from the event will go directly back to the artist and First Nation communities.

# The Sydney Modern Project, Sydney

An exciting new era in the cultural life of Australia began in December 2022, as the Art Gallery of New South Wales' new building was finally unveiled. The new standalone building – designed by Pritzker Prize—winning architects Kazuyo Sejima and Ryue Nishizawa of SANAA – is the centrepiece of the expansion. It is the most significant cultural development to open in Sydney in nearly half a century. It creates a new art museum campus comprising two buildings connected by a public art garden overlooking Sydney Harbour.

## Girri Girra, Central Coast

Girri Girra is a 100% Aboriginal-owned business operating on the NSW Central Coast that teaches people about Aboriginal society and culture on walking tours.
